Water Quality I'm chasing officers at F&H DC to move at pace on the motion passed last month on water quality improvement. Water testing starts again this month I will be monitoring it on a weekly basis. I have submitted a water quality improvement concept to the Environment Agency utilising 'citizen science' volunteers. We had some good news this week Southern Water have agreed to increase their spend on wastewater improvements from 11 million to 42 million pounds over the next few years within our district. Solar Farms No change, we are still awaiting the second round of consultation, as I said last month the threat these NSIP's mega farms would be a disaster to local business, communities and the ecology of Romney Marsh. We should hear about the next round of consultations before summer; this should have more detail for us to consider. Unitary Councils Again, we are still awaiting the decision from Government on which direction will be taken, it shouldn't be long now, once announced F&H DC are ready to swing into action and the real work will begin. Sea defences I'm still Chasing for a site meeting with the EA and NE to look at the Shoreline Management Plan No. 11 to get it changed
